## *Scientific Thought in Motion* *with Randy Barron April 10, 2010*



Randy Barron guides teachers in easy-to-duplicate lesson plans which draw upon students' kinesthetic, visual, and musical intelligences to increase their achievement in science and strengthen their repertoire of learning and social skills. Participants leave the workshop with a set of immediately useful movement activities for classroom study of science concepts, along with an understanding of the skills necessary to connect dance to other curriculum areas.

During 24 years as a teaching artist, Randy has led almost 150 professional development workshops for teachers in 25 states. He lives with his family near Tecolote, New Mexico, about 100 yards from the original Santa Fe Trail.
